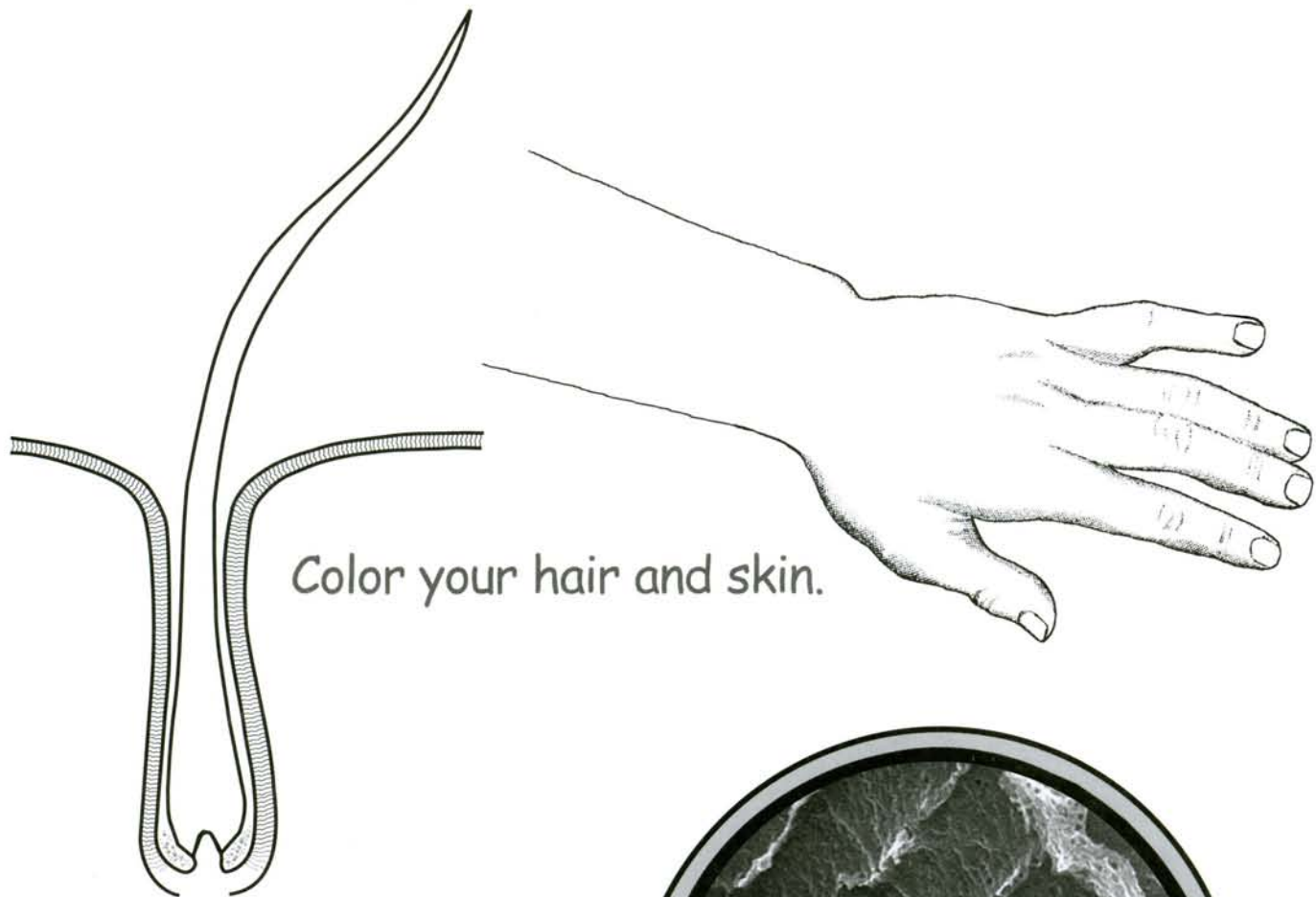

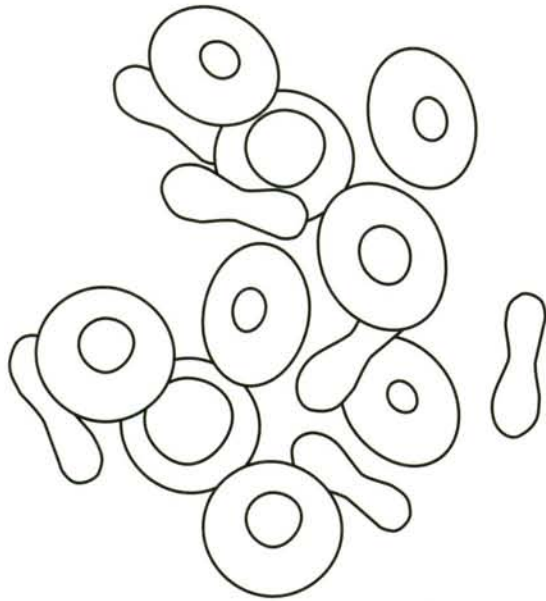
Skin:  
Magnified 2000 times



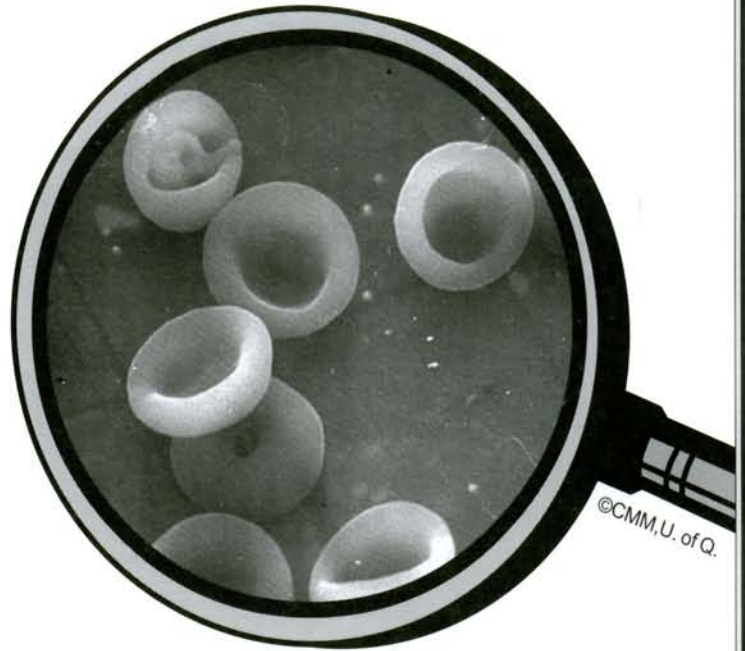

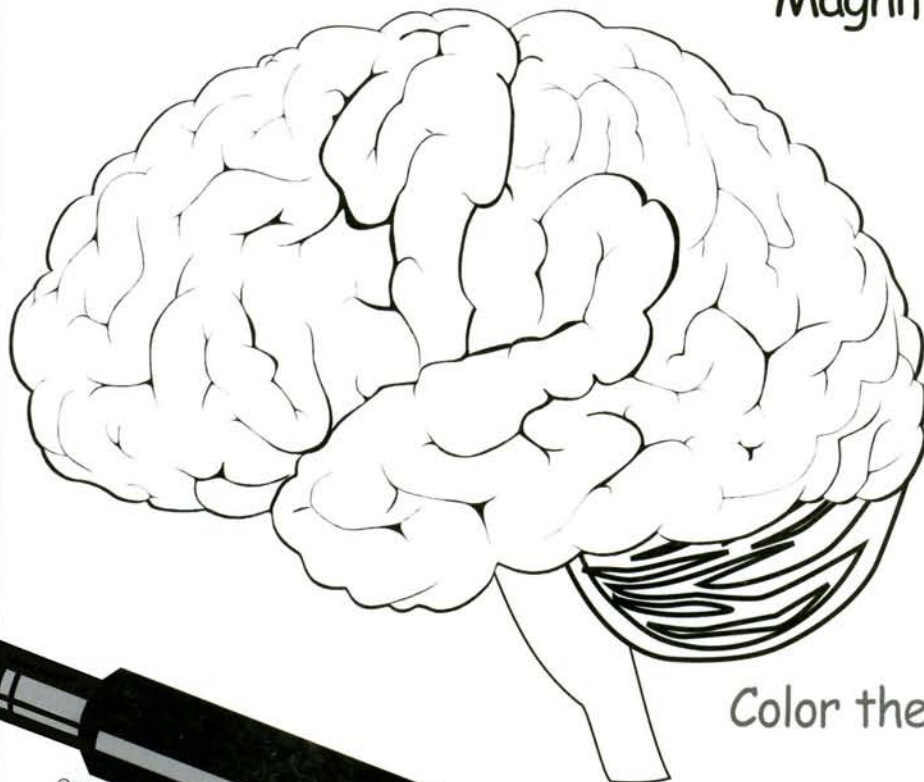
I have veins under my skin. My blood is inside my veins. My blood is dark red or bright red. The color changes depending on how much oxygen is there.
