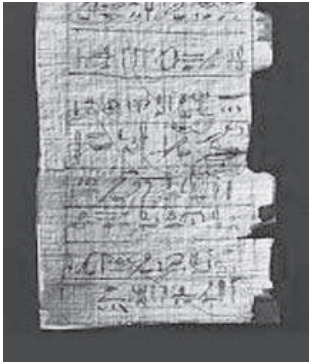
Where does paper come from?







